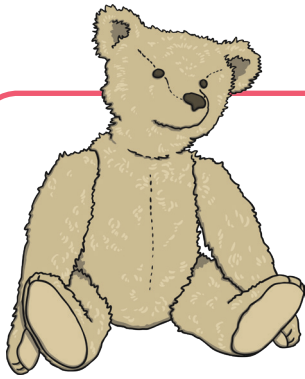
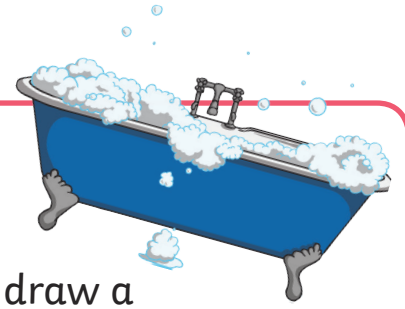


Reading Simple Sentences

Home Learning Challenges



Ask a grown-up to hide a teddy or other toy around the house. Get them to write some simple clues such as 'on the chair', 'in the box' or 'under the bed'. Follow the hunt to see if you can find the teddy.



Can you draw a picture to go with these sentences? The rat is in the tub. The cat has a long tail. The glass is full of milk.

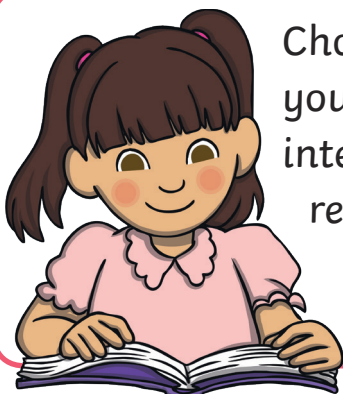
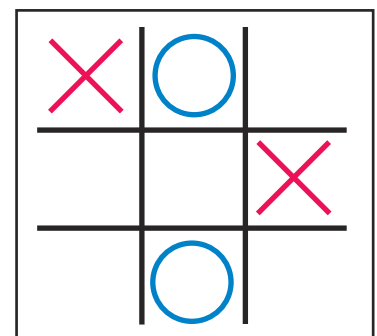


Ask a grown-up to write a secret sentence and cut it up into words. Ask them to mix up the order of the words. See if you can read the words and put them into the correct order to make the sentence.

Ask a grown-up to write some instructions to make a special snack. This could be a sandwich or even a biscuit! An example of a sentence could be: 'Take a slice of bread.' Read the sentences and follow the instructions to make the secret treat!



Ask a grown-up to draw a noughts and crosses grid on a large piece of paper and to write a simple sentence in each square. Take it in turns to read a sentence before you mark your X or O. If you want to reuse the grid you could use different coloured buttons or counters to mark the sentences instead.



Choose a picture book that you enjoy or that looks interesting. Use the words you recognise and the pictures. Can you read somebody a bedtime story?
