'On Tuesday we had a wonderful time at St Matthew's Church for Experience Easter.

Firstly, we sat down in the pews with the rest of our classmates and admired the beautiful church.

Then the vicar talked to us about Lent and the Easter story. Mrs Barfield, our teacher, formed us into groups of 6. The first station our group visited was about the Last Supper. We drank blackcurrant to represent wine and we ate bread to represent Jesus' body.

Secondly, we went to learn about The Garden of Gethsemane and how Jesus prayed but the disciples fell asleep. On the 3rd station we learned about Palm Sunday and how the people of Jerusalem welcomed Jesus by waving palm leaves. The vicar told us a story of when he went to Jerusalem and then finished with a prayer and a blessing.


We would like to thank all of the volunteers who made Experience Easter such a wonderful event for us.' by Ryan E and Summer (St Thomas More)

The children will be learning about what Autism, what it is like for children with Autism and how we can support those we know.



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
