Mr Sheppard's Colossal Burger

In Art we looked at international artists who specialised in food art. One made miniature food which was the size of a penny and another made giant food bigger than my head. So we tried making giant food ourselves.

We created a humungous burger and fries. Different pupils created different elements of the final piece.

The ketchup was made of vinyl and painted bright red, with hanging dollops. The bacon was made of different textures or cardboard, and we used glue mixed in brown paint. Next, for the lettuce, we've used a sheet of cardboard with rolled up paper for the veins and painted it with a luscious green.

Then for the bun we used calico stretched over a dome of rolled up newspapers, which was painted with acrylics using a dabbing technique. Sesame seeds the size of almonds were cut from felt. The cheese is a vinyl tile, covered in yellow tissue paper and glue.

The burger itself was formed from chicken wire covered in papier mache - we made it look really juicy by adding glue to our paint.

Finally we made chips from short cardboard boxes and painted them yellow.

The final piece is colossal and requires three of us to carry it!
